In features, Gullón has written on assignment for Warner Brothers, Fox, Regency, and Legendary. He has also collaborated with filmmakers such as Denis Villeneuve, Darren Aronofsky, and Garth Davis. Gullón was nominated for a 2019 Goya Award for his adaptation of *Advantages Of Traveling by Train*.

In television, Gullón is developing *Passengers* with Johan Renck attached to direct and Michael London executive producing. Prior, he developed an original sci-fi series entitled *Glare* for HBO and Bad Robot.

Gullón began his career just after graduating university when he sold his first screenplay *El Rey De La Montaña*, which was produced with Gonzalo Lopez-Gallego directing. He currently resides in Los Angeles with his family.
